Quick Guide to Declaring Interests at GMCA Meetings

Please Note: should you have a personal interest that is prejudicial in an item on the agenda, you should leave the meeting for the duration of the discussion and the voting thereon.

This is a summary of the rules around declaring interests at meetings. It does not replace the Member's Code of Conduct, the full description can be found in the GMCA's constitution Part 7A.

Your personal interests must be registered on the GMCA's Annual Register within 28 days of your appointment onto a GMCA committee and any changes to these interests must notified within 28 days. Personal interests that should be on the register include:

- 1. Bodies to which you have been appointed by the GMCA
- 2. Your membership of bodies exercising functions of a public nature, including charities, societies, political parties or trade unions.

You are also legally bound to disclose the following information called Disclosable Personal Interests which includes:

- **T** You, and your partner's business interests (eg employment, trade, profession, contracts, or any company with which you are associated).

 Quantum and your partner's wider financial interests (eg trust funds, investments, and assets including land and property).

Any sponsorship you receive.

Failure to disclose this information is a criminal offence

Step One: Establish whether you have an interest in the business of the agenda

- 1. If the answer to that question is 'No' then that is the end of the matter.
- 2. If the answer is 'Yes' or Very Likely' then you must go on to consider if that personal interest can be construed as being a prejudicial interest.

Step Two: Determining if your interest is prejudicial

A personal interest becomes a prejudicial interest:

- 1. where the wellbeing, or financial position of you, your partner, members of your family, or people with whom you have a close association (people who are more than just an acquaintance) are likely to be affected by the business of the meeting more than it would affect most people in the area.
- 2. the interest is one which a member of the public with knowledge of the relevant facts would reasonably regard as so significant that it is likely to prejudice your judgement of the public interest.

For a non-prejudicial interest, you must:

- 1. Notify the governance officer for the meeting as soon as you realise you have an interest.
- 2. Inform the meeting that you have a personal interest and the nature of the interest.
- 3. Fill in the declarations of interest form.

You may remain in the room and speak and vote on the matter

For prejudicial interests, you must:

- 1. Notify the governance officer for the meeting as soon as you realise you have a prejudicial interest (before or during the meeting).
- 2. Inform the meeting that you have a prejudicial interest and the nature of the interest.
- 3. Fill in the declarations of interest form.
- 4. Leave the meeting while that item of business is discussed.
- 5. Make sure the interest is recorded on your annual register of interests form if it relates to you or your partner's business or financial affairs. If it is not on the Register update it within 28 days of the interest becoming apparent.

You must not:

Participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your disclosable pecuniary interest during the meeting participate further in any discussion of the business, participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

1.1 The final outturn position for the year ending 31 March 2023 shows a breakeven position following transfer from reserve of £76k.

1.3 The outturn position reflects:

- Additional expenditure by the Police and Crime Panel of £36k offset by add additional grant from Home Office of £69k leading to an overall underspend of £33k;
- The SharePoint system enables the secure sharing of data across GM, Wigan hosts the platform on behalf of AGMA districts. The AGMA share of the cost of the SharePoint system in 2022/23 was £34k which will continue in 2023/24. The cost is calculated annually based on the number of users;

- Flood and water management expenditure of £51k has been met from AGMA reserves in 2022/23 as previously reported to AGMA in February 2023;
- Other small variances in relation to AGMA running costs (£5k), GM Protect Duty (£7k) and Archaeology Service (£4k) due to additional uplift to fund the service in 2022/23.
- 1.4 A contribution from reserves of £76k has been made which brings the position to breakeven.

2. RESERVES

2.1 The 2021/22 closing position on AGMA reserves reported to the Board in June 2022 was £553k, however additional movements, mainly relating to County Records were transacted which restates the opening balance in 2022/23 to 513k. The position at the end of 2022/23 has led to transfer from reserve of £76k decreasing the reserve to £437k.
