The decision is that:

Funding of £6,000 be provided to pay for the editing, proof reading, report designing, and publication costs associated with the Baird Inquiry report.

Breakdown of costs - £1,500 for editing and £1,500 for proof reading £1,500 for design of the report and £1,500 for the printing of 50 hard copies

The reasons for the decision are:

The Inquiry report is a lengthy and complex document and requires both professional editing and proof reading to ensure that it meets publication standards and guidance.

The report is high profile and is relevant to several key partners. Given this fact and the significant media interest it is appropriate that key partners and individuals receive a hard copy of the report, and that this is to a professional standard.

This decision will contribute to priorities of the Greater Manchester strategy in the following ways:

An open and transparent public facing report is essential to supporting victims and increasing public confidence, particularly with women and girls. This is a key priority of the Police and Crime Plan.
