The decision is that:

Funding be allocated up to the amount of £350 for the printing of promotional material for the Victims of Crime survey by Manchester City Council.

The reasons for the decision are:

In order to interview victims for the Victims of Crime survey rights 8-12, promotional material has been created which will be sent to victims via the GMP Witness Care Unit and the Probation Service Victims Contact Scheme and Victim Notification Scheme. The printing will be done by Manchester City Council through their in house printing service. The quote is for £85 for the first print run but the Decision Notice is for £350 to allow for increased print runs.

This decision will contribute to priorities of the the Greater Manchester strategy in the following ways:

The funding will help support the commitment to 'Enable resilient, safe and vibrant communities where everyone has access to essential services' by ensuring victims voices are heard. The survey will help the CA, GMP and Probation service and wider criminal justice organisations to understand where victims feels improvements can be made and to deliver those improvements.
